DWDE's mission is to facilitate and promote the economic empowerment of persons with disabilities through the transformation of collective work schemes and the development of innovative employment support services.


# DWDE (THE LEADING DISABILITY EMPLOYMENT SUPPORT SERVICES PROVIDER)

# SHORT TERM EMPLOYMENT INDEPENDENT DEVELOPMENT TRUST (IDT) EPWP PROGRAMME

DWDE implemented the Expanded Public Works Program in partnership with The Independent Development Trust (IDT). In the financial year 2023/24 the program commenced on 03 July 2023 and closed out on 20 February 2024. We received an allocation of 150 work opportunities for unemployed persons with disabilities in the Western Cape. The Program enabled us to expand and offer work opportunities in more areas such as Gugulethu, Crossroads, Cape Town International Airport, Claremont, Khayelitsha, Philippi, Dunoon, Mfuleni, Nyanga, Fish Hoek-Masiphumelele and Strand. The total of 150 Apart from the Protective Workshops were based at varied sites which included Early Childhood Development Centres; Day clinics; Public schools, Special Schools, disability organisations, a community food garden and a public library.

The demographics of the 150 were 89% persons with disabilities, 55% Women and 59% Youth. The work opportunity roles included 6 site supervisors and 144 general workers doing different roles from office administration; cleaning; recycling, sewing, woodwork, food gardening, teacher Assistants and community development workers. The beneficiaries and hosting partners gave positive end-of-program feedback, stating that the program is of great benefit to the disability community. The EPWP has allowed unemployed persons with disabilities to be exposed to potential employers, to gain work experience and to be financially independent through stipends received. The program has also allowed DWDE to establish and strengthen relations with more communities where the workers were based and indirectly facilitated disability awareness practically.

# DSD FUNDED PROGRAMMES: SKILLS DEVELOPMENT & JOB READINESS TRAINING

For the financial year April 2023 - March 2024, DWDE has successfully facilitated skills development programs that reached a total of 300 unemployed persons with disabilities from various disadvantaged areas in the Western Cape. The 300 unemployed persons with disabilities benefited through our different programs such as Job Readiness Training, GBV Awareness, Recruitment and Placement onto Call Centre Learnership and short-term employment opportunities.





#### PROTECTIVE WORKSHOP MANAGERS FORUM

DWDE served as a Secretariat to the 42 Provincial Protective Workshop Manager's Forum and the Vredenburg Subforums in the Western Cape. The purpose of the Forum is to bring together and strengthen the collective voice of Managers and Coordinators of DSD Funded Protective Workshops in the Western Cape. At the quarterly engagements, the Managers discuss matters affecting the overall being of the Protective Workshops i.e. Governance, Compliance, operational matters, Capacity building, Sustainability, and Alternative funding.

The Protective Workshop Managers Forum successfully held its Annual combined Hybrid Summit. The theme of the Summit was Sustainability & Alternative Funding Going Forward. The objective of the summit was to equip Protective Workshop Managers /Coordinators with knowledge on how to work together towards the sustainability of their organisations amidst the reduced government funding.
